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Letter from Public Health Administrator

Scott County is a rural community that values relationships within its own community. They are dedicated to each other and invest in resources that will help increase the success of the community. Each local community health department knows its community and can advocate for its residents simply because they know and experience the same struggles. Local health departments monitor trends, act as resources, and actively focus on reducing social determinants of health. The Scott County Health Department cares deeply about our community. It focuses on identifying barriers so it can readily produce solutions to make the greatest impact on disparities, vulnerabilities, and disease.

During the fiscal year 2024, Scott County Health Department expanded programming and took opportunities to address its Illinois Project for Local Assessment of Needs (IPLAN) in search of community health education. Wendy Smith joined the team as a health educator and is working in the community to support and connect programming. We were also awarded the Department of Human Services grant, Teen Reach, which is an excellent opportunity to expand health education and connect high-risk students to programming, connections, and resources. Additionally, during this year, we hired a new Environmental Health Technician, Brett Holmes, who has begun training as an Environmental Health Inspector. We partner with Greene County Health Department for Administrative functions as Molly Peters is the Public Health Administrator, and Allison Varble is the Fiscal Manager. Current full-time/part-time staff include Marsha Faulkner- Office Manager, Angela Hoots, Meghan VanDeVelde- Registered Nursing Staff BSN, Brett Holmes-Environmental Health Technician, and Wendy Smith- Health Educator. Contracted staff include Liz Stemm, Environmental Health Inspector. Temporary employees working under the Teen Reach /program include MacKenzie Gieseke-Site Program Manager, Jocelyn Dolen- Site Program Mentor, and Elizabeth Adcock- Site Program Mentor.

We want to extend our appreciation to the Scott County Board of Health and Scott County elected officials for their continued support in ensuring the health department remains a valued service in this community. Also, we have a lot of gratitude for the Winchester School District's support of the Teen Reach Program as it is paramount to the program to maintain this connection. There is great value in services provided to a rural community and assurance of impacting the social determinants of health and equity for all people in the State of Illinois. Maintaining the local government's capacity to serve improves trust in health systems and assures advocates for healthy communities. We are also very thankful for all the agency partners, staff, and volunteers who ensure the stability of rural health services.
